Job Opportunity: 2IC/Stock Manager – Permanent Full-time

Business Name: Waytemore Farms Limited

Property Summary: Waytemore Farms Limited is a 1,455ha privately owned farming

enterprise, bringing together three family-owned properties managed as one cohesive operation. Two adjoining farms (1,177ha) support a dairy platform alongside a sheep and beef unit, while a nearby 277ha block is home to a second dairy farm. Located across the rural communities of Ararimu, Paparimu, and Paparata, the properties sit

on Auckland's southern boundary.

The business operates a mixed farming model with 2,100 Romney ewes, 720 beef cattle, and 860 dairy cows plus 360 heifer replacements. Over the last five years, Waytemore Farms has transitioned to a largely closed system, with its dairy and beef enterprises strategically integrated to support one another.

Profitability is balanced with environmental stewardship. The team actively protects and enhances indigenous forests, waterways, and wetlands, a commitment recognised with the 2022 New Zealand Farm Environment Trust Regional Supreme Award and several other awards. Sustainability is embedded across the entire operation, driving continuous improvements in both environmental outcomes and farm performance.

Waytemore Farms is a well-resourced, efficiently laid-out business with excellent infrastructure and is well tracked, enabling smooth stock movement and operational efficiency.

The 2IC/Stock Manager plays a key role in supporting the Farm Business Manager across Waytemore Farms' 949ha sheep and cattle operation. This role is hands on and highly involved in the day-to-day management of all Drystock, with a particular focus on young cattle. The sheep are predominately run at one end of the farm due to woolshed location. 600 ewe lambs are kept for replacements with the remainder of the lambs finished or sold store depending on seasonal conditions.

The cattle operation is diverse, comprising a mix of beef cattle systems. All Friesian bull calves are reared, with some sold as weaners and others carried through to yearlings, while Hereford-cross steer and heifer calves are finished. Each November, the sheep and beef platform also receives heifer calves from the dairy units. These dairy

replacements are grown out to R2 in-calf heifers, synchronised, artificially inseminated, and then followed up with low birth-weight bulls before returning to the dairy herd.

This role is central to the smooth operation of the livestock systems, requiring strong stockmanship, attention to detail, and the ability to manage seasonal variations in stock flow.

Key responsibilities include:

- Organising the pasture and feed management to maintain required growth rates for all stock.
- Stock rotations and managing the animal health programme.
- Feeding out at certain times of year to maintain growth weights.
- Weighing and reporting weights of sheep and cattle.
- Experienced in identifying animal health issues and administering appropriate treatments.
- High level of stockmanship with 3 4 working dogs.
- Ability to maintain accurate stock records and tallies.
- Good understanding of pasture and feed management.
- Clear communication skills both written and verbal.
- Ability to work autonomously and show initiative.
- Machinery operating experience such as tractor/digger driving.
- Understanding of and experience with NAIT.
- Easy going, with a good sense of humour and the ability to work as part of a team.
- Excellent work ethic and pride in your work and presentation.




Cows - AI for 6 weeks split between dairy and beef semen Bull is out for a further 2-3 weeks.

Animal Health Practices: There is a strong Animal Health plan in place, and you will be working with the Farm Business Manager to implement it.


Cropping Policy: Planting 20ha of summer cropping this coming season.
